humbled and emptied and conscious of their helplessness. Paul, the most eminent of His saints, must suffer from a thorn in the flesh to remind him of his weakness, and confessed that only when he was weak could he be strong (II Corinthians 12:10). When a soul is inflated with a strong reliance on its own sufficiency, the power of God is unable to make an entrance or use that soul as a

channel for its work. It is when we are willing to be accounted as worms, as broken reeds, as little children, as foolish, weak, despised, as "things which are not," that we become aware of being vehicles for the working of the might of His power. You must be brought to an end of yourself before God can begin with you.
